### 2. Statewides Legislative Ask

Oregon's legislative session ended in June. Our initial ask was folded into HB5025, which included the line items for OSU Statewides (Extension, Ag Experiment Station, Forest Research Lab) funding. The bill, as passed by the House and Senate, provides for **full continued service level funding** and additional funding dedicated to Extension to work with agricultural producers to support and expand organic agriculture sectors.

From Director Lyles: While it is premature to commit to specifics until budgets are finalized, I do want to reiterate my priorities for this funding:

- Keeping a state-funded 4-H professional in all counties that partner with Extension.
- Hiring an Extension Christmas Tree specialist.
- Filling at least 4 community horticulture/Master Gardener coordinator positions.
- Filling a third position focused on grass seed production.
- Adding a position to support organic agriculture production.
- Adding expertise in behavioral health.
- Continuing to support and retain our excellent faculty and staff by investing in relevant training and professional development.
