How many hours do students complete?	90 hour practicum (4 credits) 300 hour internship (12 credits)	90 hour internship (3 credits)	360 hour internship (12 credits)	160-200 hour internship (4-6 credits)
What do students do in the practicum or internship?	HDFS students gain hands-on experience supporting clients. For example, they may help clients access food, supervise children, visit families in their homes, plan and manage activities, and help clients access community resources.	Kinesiology students complete field experience based on individual interest. They may reflect on competencies, and create/lead fitness plans, wellness programming, and other human health and movement-based projects.	Undergraduate students work on projects, such as conducting community outreach; assisting with public health program planning, implementation, & evaluation; creating educational documents; completing administrative activities in hospitals and clinics; and assisting with health policy related activities.	MPH students work on a project that leads to at least 2 deliverables that demonstrate 5 MPH competencies . Examples may include but are not limited to: written report, program plan, program evaluation, data visualization, presentation, policy brief, system map, survey, needs assessment, and focus group guide.
What are the preceptor/site supervisor requirements?	At least a Bachelor's degree (or extensive experience in field), meet weekly with student to complete required documents, answer questions, and provide ongoing mentoring.	Preceptor background relates to the field of kinesiology.	At least a Bachelor's degree in a field related to Public Health.	Graduate degree or extensive experience in a field related to public health, and availability to meet with student on regular basis.
